

Covid 19 Protocol for Community of Christ 2022 Youth Camps at CB

The procedures for our youth camps will be as follows.

- We encourage all campers and staff to be up to date with Covid 19 vaccinations.
- All campers and staff are asked to bring a negative Covid 19 test to camp. (This includes those who are vaccinated.) This test must be completed within 3 days of start of camp (e.g., if camp starts on Sunday afternoon, the tests should be dated on the Thursday, Friday or Saturday just before camp.)
- For those campers and staff who aren't able to bring a negative test, we will have self administered, home tests available on arrival at camp which may be taken. We're asking for a donation of \$5 for each test to help offset the cost.
- All campers and staff who have been vaccinated should bring copies of their vaccination records. This will be useful for camp medical personnel. If more convenient, copies of the vaccination records and copies of negative Covid tests may be emailed or texted to:

- Campers and staff are encouraged to self-isolate in the days just prior to camp to lessen potential exposure.

The presence of any of the symptoms below generally suggests a person has an infectious illness and should not attend camp, regardless of whether the illness is Covid-19.

- Temperature of 100.4 F or higher
- Sore throat
- Cough (for campers with chronic cough due to allergies or asthma, a change in their cough from baseline)
- Difficulty breathing (if asthma, a change from baseline breathing)
- Diarrhea or vomiting
- New onset of severe headache, especially with a fever.

Each camper and staff member will be checked by camp medical personnel at check in. Mask usage is welcomed throughout the week but is optional except as described below.

Response to suspected or confirmed cases at camp

If a camper develops any of the above mentioned symptoms a parent or guardian will be informed. The camper will be isolated in a specified area supervised by staff members who have been vaccinated. All will wear masks. A rapid Covid 19 test will be administered by camp medical personnel. If positive, the camper will remain in isolation until transportation arrives. **The camper must be picked up from camp the same day as the parents/guardian are informed. If the parents or guardians may not be able to do this, please pre- arrange for alternate transportation.**
